----- CLUB NEWS ------

#### Money, Money, Money

It is quite appropriate for a golf club that we can report sighting some "green shoots of recovery" recently. After a few years of struggling and having to report annual deficits we have begun to see a small improvement in our finances. This is due mainly to an increase in members and green fees received.

New members have joined in all sections this year, due in no small part to the various schemes developed in the last year or two, which continue to be reviewed and revitalised. New member subscriptions are good for the whole club and some short-term offers are leading to longer-term dividends.

Green fees have seen an increase this year, although Society income is still very low. Visitors that have come have enjoyed the course, as we all do, and often compliment the green keeper for the excellent greens and layout they find. A number of visitors who have called in whilst on holiday often call again and that is a great compliment.

Increased Green Fees from individuals and societies help the club's finances and we should all encourage visitors and locals to come to our course and try it out.

The committee has committed to spending some money this year on one off items, some of which are described below:

- 1. Kitchen equipment and renovations ~ Money was spent earlier in the year in fitting the hood, replacing one of the fridges and other small works. The expenditure together with the considerable input of Owain and Sylvia helped us improve our kitchen rating this year to "5", the highest available and is a remarkable achievement for our club.
- 2. Additional container ~ an additional storage container has been purchased to provide more secure space for our grounds equipment, both owned and rented, to reduce risks of damage or loss from previously having to leave some items outside.
- 3. Shed ~ A shed has been purchased with a view to establishing a Trolley Bay that members may use to

leave their trolleys, much like we use the lockers for golf clubs at the moment. When the shed has been erected and adapted members will be invited to "rent" a space, as for lockers, and if there is a demand for this a further purchase may be considered.

A full picture of our finances will be presented at the AGM early in 2015, and I will start work on this as soon as I have finished my usual December role in Dickens' "A Christmas Carol."
